Welcome and Announcements

Call to Worship (excerpts from Colossians)

Leader: The book of Colossians tells us that Jesus Christ is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation.

People: In him all things in heaven and on earth were created, things visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or powers—all things have been created through him and for him. He himself is before all things, and in him all things hold together.

*Cantor: "Will you come and follow me if I but call your name?
Will you go where you don't know and never be the same?
Will you let my love be shown; will you let my name be known;
Will you let my life be grown in you and you in me?"*

Leader: Jesus is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, so that he might come to have first place in everything.

People: For in Jesus all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, and through him God was pleased to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, by making peace through the blood of his cross.

*Cantor: "Will you help the blinded see if I but call your name?
Will you set the prisoners free and never be the same?
Will you kiss the leper clean, and do such as this unseen,
And admit to what I mean in you and you in me?"*

Leader: As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience. Bear with one another and, if anyone has a complaint against another, forgive each other; just as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony.

People: And may the peace of Christ rule in our hearts, to which indeed we were called in one body. And let us be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in us richly; and with gratitude in our hearts let us sing songs to God. And whatever we do, in word or deed, let us do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

Thus I'll move and live and grow in you and you in me.*

Leader: How do you live in the communion of the Holy Spirit?

People: By the Holy Spirit, I am made one with the Lord Jesus Christ. I am baptized into Christ's body, the church. As a member of this community, I trust in God's Word, share in the Lord's Supper, and turn to God in prayer. As I grow in grace and knowledge, I am led to do the good works that God intends for my life

Leader: What is the mission of the church?

People: The mission of the church is to bear witness to God's love for the world in Jesus Christ.

Leader: What forms does this mission take?

People: The church's mission takes a wide variety of forms, including evangelism, work for social justice, and ministries of care. Yet the center is always the same: Jesus Christ. In every case the church extends mercy and forgiveness to the needy in a way that points finally to him.

Leader: Who are the needy?

People: The hungry need bread, the homeless need a roof, the oppressed need justice, and the lonely need fellowship. At the same time — on another and deeper level — the hopeless need hope, sinners need forgiveness, and the world needs the gospel. On this level no one is excluded, and all the needy are one. Our mission as the church is to bring hope to a desperate world by declaring God's undying love — as one beggar tells another where to find bread.
